The Bearsted Woodland Trust

What is Bearsted Woodland Trust?

The role of the Bearsted Woodland Trust (BWT) is to manage and preserve the land at Church Landway, for the benefit of wildlife and the local community. The BWT has recently been established as an independent charity and is currently made up of founder trustees and a small committee.

How you can be involved with Bearsted Woodland Trust

A Friends of Bearsted Woodland Trust is being established and anyone from the local community can be involved. As a Friend of BWT you will not only be kept fully involved and updated in developments, you will also have the opportunity to help your local area through volunteering at events and activities at Church Landway.

Individuals and groups will be asked for a small contribution (£2.50/individual, £5/ family per year) to be part of the Friends of Bearsted Woodland Trust to cover costs such as newsletters and administration fees.

There is also the opportunity to be part of The Bearsted Woodland Trust Committee, to find out more, or become a Friend of BWT just fill in the attached slip.





You may have seen the name Medway Valley Countryside Partnership (MVCP) in connection with the work at Church Landway. The MVCP are

overseeing the first year of work at the site, giving

securing funds.

After the first year the MVCP will continue to offer background support to the Friends of Bearsted Woodland Trust as needed. MVCP is a not for profit organisation based in Maidstone. MVCP work with local communities, landowners, schools and other local groups to look after the countryside and wildlife.

Proposed changes!

A plan for the Bearsted Woodland Trust site has been developed, to preserve and manage the site as an accessible open space with great benefits to the local community and wildlife.

Aspects of the plan include:

- the grassland, orchard and scrub areas to be restored to provide valuable habitats for wildlife,
- informal paths installed to improve access,
- an informal seating and an educational wildlife area to be created,
- trees and hedges to be planted


